Our mission is to provide sound stewardship to the County's wild lands and opportunities for the appreciation of their intrinsic value.

The Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners established Brooker Creek Preserve in 1992. Managed by the

Environmental Lands Division within the Department of Environmental Management, the Preserve is just over 8,000 acres making it the largest wilderness area in Pinellas County. Since its conception, the Preserve has been dedicated to preserving wilderness areas for future generations by protecting water resources and enhancing native plant and animal habitats.

Increasing public awareness of

natural Florida is accomplished by promoting educational experiences, providing passive recreational opportunities, and restoring native communities and hydrology.

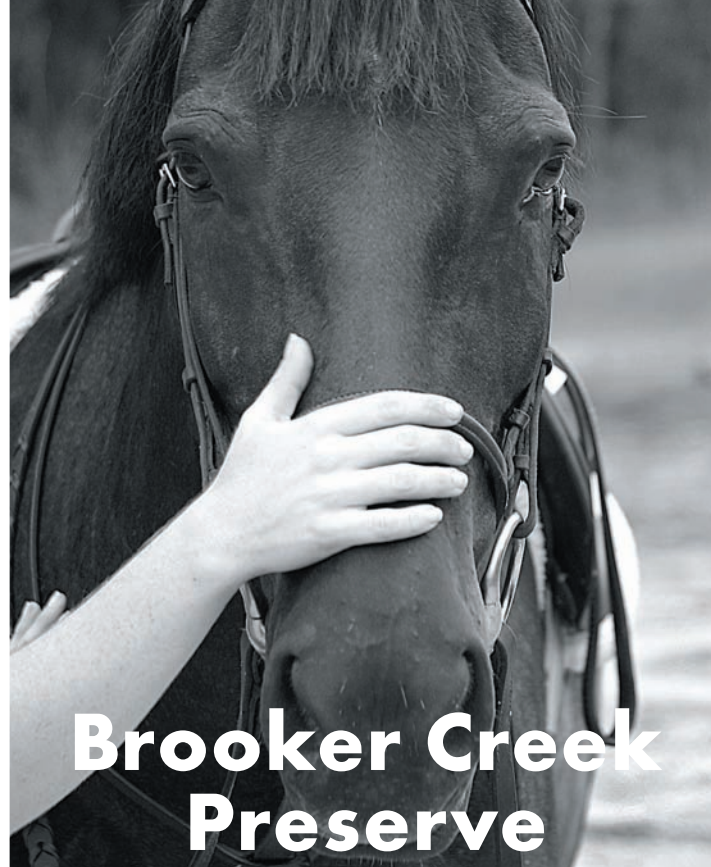

WELCOME TO BROOKER CREEK PRESERVE'S EQUESTRIAN TRAILS

Please help us manage these trails for your enjoyment and the protection of our natural resources.

Please:

- Only horses with riders are allowed.
- Riders must remain on designated trails.
- Remove all trash.
- Do not disturb native plants and animals – they are protected.

The following are PROHIBITED:

- Domesticated animals (except horses)
- Unauthorized vehicles, including bicycles, motorcycles, and all-terrain vehicles
- Pedestrians, including hikers and joggers
- Alcoholic beverages
- Glass containers
- Weapons/firearms or fireworks
- Smoking

ABOUT OUR TRAILS

Our equestrian trails are natural paths that are maintained through periodic mowing. Hitching posts and paddocks are not provided. Water is always a must. Please bring enough for both you and your horse. Sunscreen, a hat, and insect repellent are suggested.

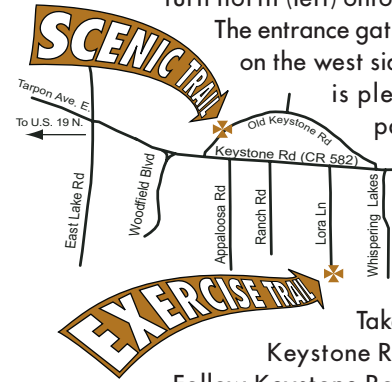
RIDERS – PLEASE NOTE

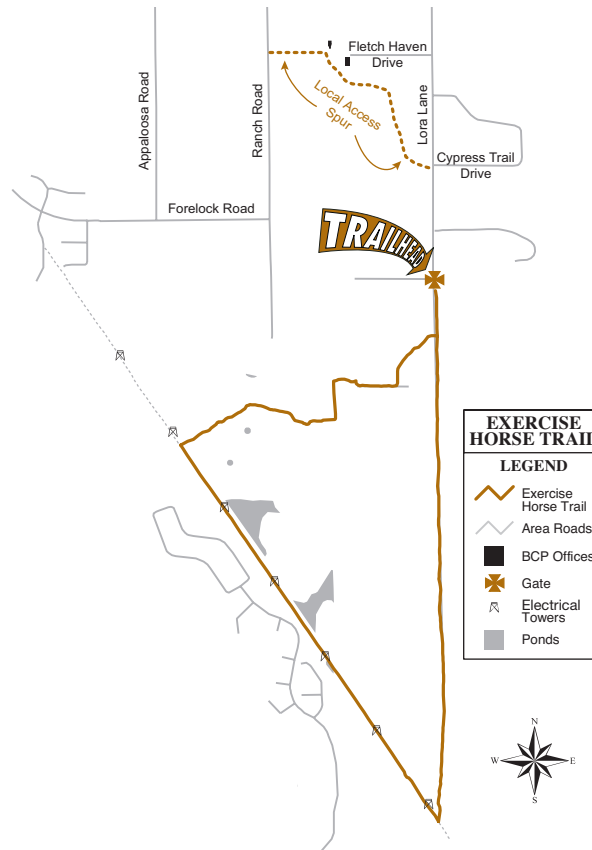
DIRECTIONS

To the Scenic Horse Trail – Take East Lake Road and turn east onto Keystone Road. Continue east and turn north (left) onto Old Keystone Road. The entrance gate to the trail is located on the west side of the road. There is plenty of space for parking your vehicle and horse trailer at the trailhead.

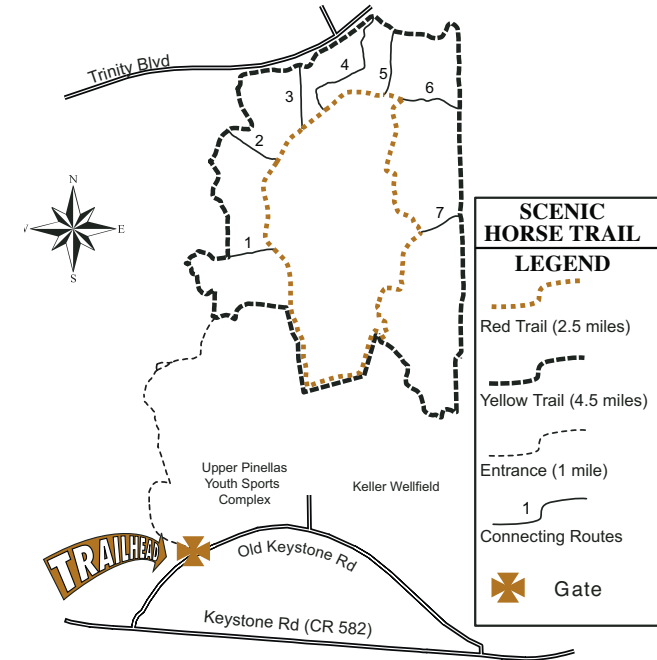


To the Exercise Horse Trail – Take East Lake Road to Keystone Road and turn east. Follow Keystone Road and turn south (right) onto Lora Lane. The trailhead is located at the end of road. Sorry, no horse trailer parking available at this site. A spur off Ranch Road allows for local access.
